COMMERCIALIZATION OF MICRO AND NANO SYSTEMS CONFERENCE

## **Abstract Guidelines**

Presenters should address one or more of the following general areas:

- Commercialization of micro or nanotechnology products
- Innovative new technologies or products
- Successful business strategies
- Industry or technology overviews

Your abstract must include all of the following:

1. Abstract/presentation title.
2. Author listing, with the principal author listed first. For each author, provide his/her name, organization, complete mailing address, telephone, fax and e-mail address.
3. Main subject addressed. Choose one from the following subjects: transportation, biological, industrial, consumer, communications, environmental, security and homeland defense, roadmapping, strategic management of technology, cost modeling, standards, relationships needed for commercialization, the role of foundries in commercialization, investment strategies, the role of venture capital in commercialization, government's role in commercial development, and universities' role in commercial development.
4. Abstract text. The text should be 250 to 500 words in length. Abstracts should contain enough detail to clearly make the subject and the approach understandable for the reviewers.

To ensure a high-quality conference, all abstracts will be reviewed by the COMS 2004 Conference Program Committee for suitability of content.

Only original material should be submitted.

Commercial presentations, sales pitches or technology papers with no commercialization content will not be accepted.

Manuscript due dates must be strictly observed. Late manuscripts will not be accepted, and as a consequence, the presentation will be cancelled.

All authors are expected to register for the meeting and pay the early registration fee.

## **Submission Guidelines**

All submissions must be sent via email in Microsoft Word format (\*.doc). Abstracts should be sent on or before the deadline to: [COMS2004Papers@nanomems.org](mailto:COMS2004Papers@nanomems.org). The subject line of the email should contain the words "COMS2004 abstract" and the name of the principal author.
